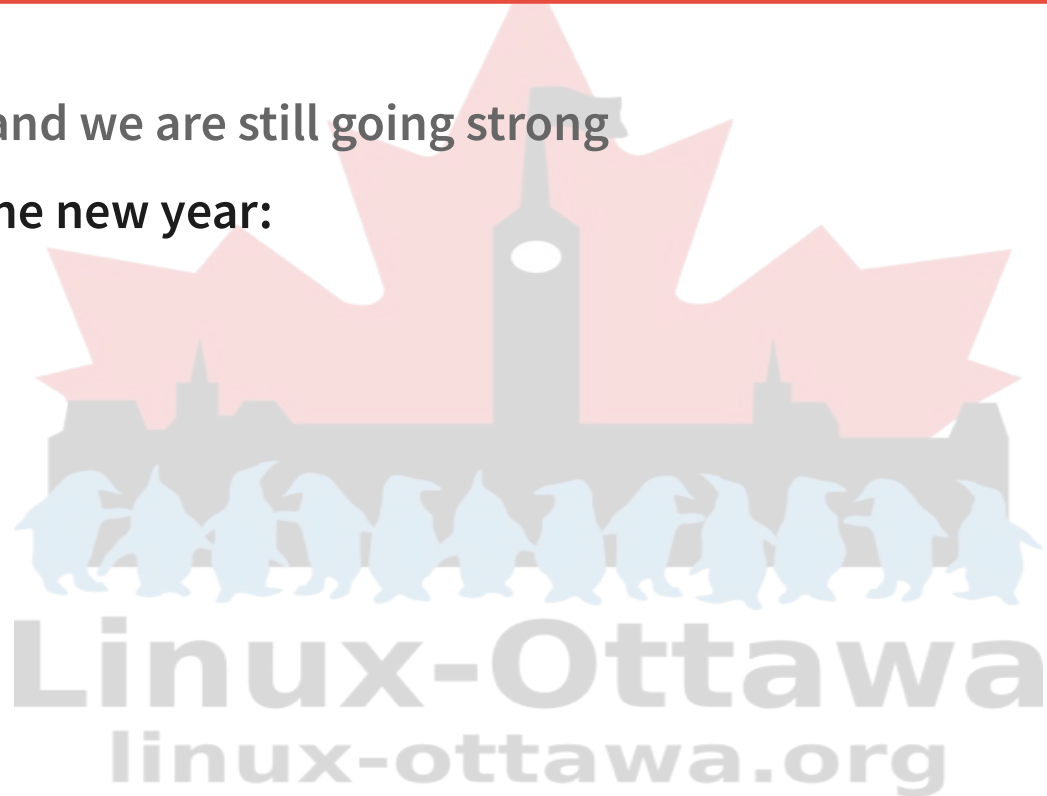

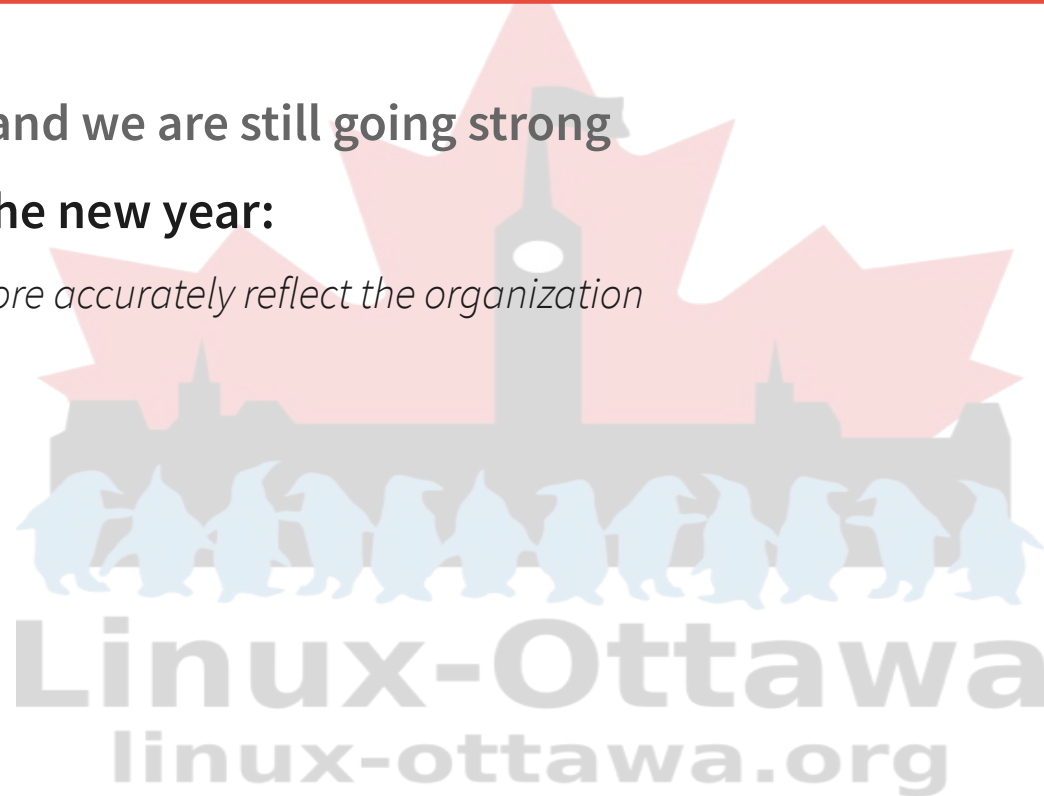

Cost recovery for the room:

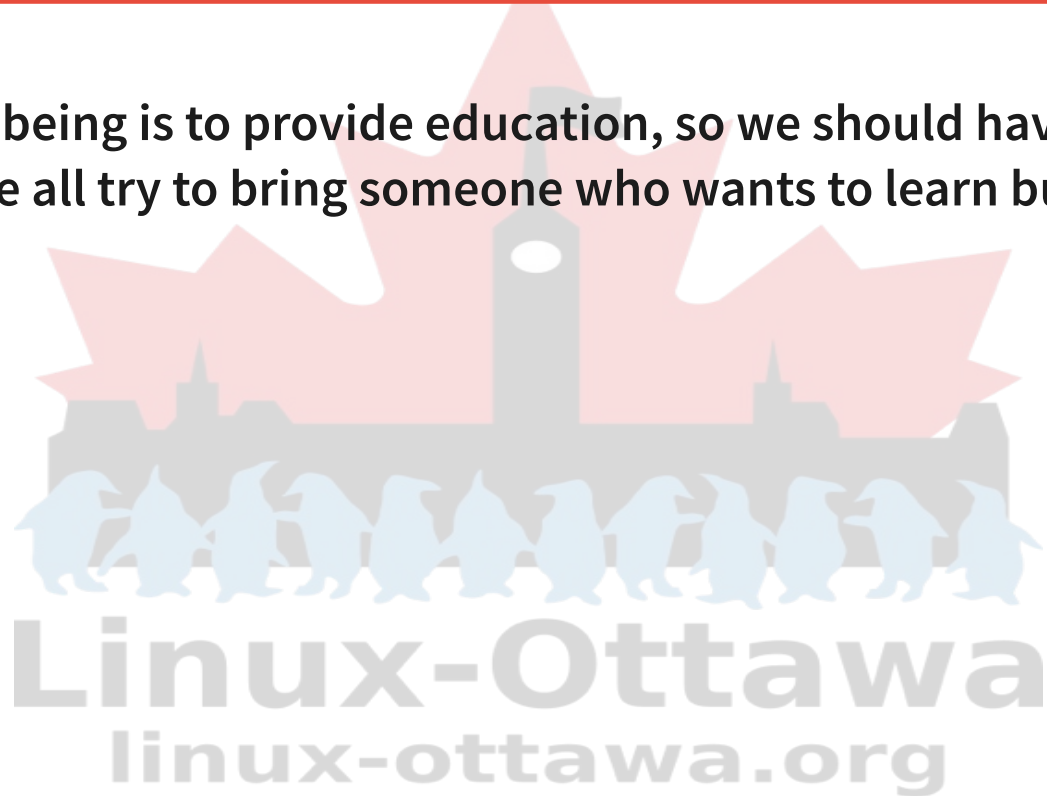
Donations: Passing the hat.
