Twitter vs Mastodon



- I (almost) don't use twitter.
 - I use it as a 2nd rate news feed (2nd rate feed, not 2nd rate news)
- I don't use mastodon.
- Mastodon is not twitter
 - Can be a company website
 - Bulletin board / mailing list
 - Interconnected broadcast messaging service
- I'm less comfortable with Twitter under Musk.
- Wasn't comfortable before...

Where will Twitter go?

- if fears about direction, I can suggest Mastodon.
- Twitter doesn't make a profit.
- Revenue mostly advertising.
- Advertisers are fickle.
- Linux users can feel schadenfreude when closed source business models stumble.

Blue ticks

- Twitter single bucket of users
- Is @Mr_Ego the real Mr Ego?
- Need blue ticks for validation
 - USD 8 / month
 - 400k * 8 * 12 = USD 38 million / year.
 - Musk fired top 3 officials, cost USD 200 million.
 - 5 years for blue tick to pay for first 3 firings.
 - If all blue ticks start paying, and advertisers remain happy

Blue ticks

- To pay back purchase cost
 - 400k * 8 * 12 = USD 38 million / year.
 - Musk paid USD 44 billion.
 - 1,158 years for blue tick to pay for purchase.
 - Not counting lost opportunity cost
 - If all blue ticks start paying, and advertisers remain happy

Centralised vs Distributed

- How to classify the degree of centralisation of a system
 - **Centralised** Twitter, Facebook, Instagram
 - **Federated** Email, XMPP, phone networks, physical mail.
 - Distributed BitTorrent (shared files), IPFS (distributed file system),
 Scuttlebutt (shared data structures)
- Everyone understands email
 - people using different email servers.
 - you can communicate from one server to another.
- Mastodon is federated
 - you can follow a mastodon account on a different server.
 - Can be a single website based communication channel remaining internal.

Mastodon user

- twitter account is of the form
 - @mr_ego
- mastadon requires a domain
 - @mr_ego@twitter.com
 - hypothetical examples
 - @Bill_Gates@microsoft.com
 - @Elon_Musk@tesla.com
 - @JustinTrudeau@commons.gc.ca

Mastodon user

- no need for "blue ticks", domain already trusted
- There isn't as much data as on twitter.
- I don't want to broadcast anything public.
- I don't follow people.
- I can't form an opinion about Mastodon usability.

Create mastodon account

- Creating an user account to connect to mastodon is easy.
 - https://joinmastodon.org/servers
 - select a server and connect to it.
 - Some servers are for niche interests, some are general.
 - Some servers are automatic, some require approval.
- mastodon.social
 - "The original server maintained by the Mastodon gGmbH non-profit"
 - doesn't require approval (you must agree to be civilised)

Mastodon server

- As open source, anyone can set up a server.
 - Akin to setting up an email server.
 - Truth Social and Gab are based on Mastodon.
 - Can be used
 - internally on an intranet.
 - publicly, with following users on other servers

Move server

- Mastodon allows you to switch from server to server.
- Download your data, and upload it to another server.
- Your login id is an email address.
- Your original supplier is closing, or evolving "morally"
 - switch to another domain.
 - your username might not be available on new server
 - Just like email

Install Server

- https://docs.joinmastodon.org/admin/install/
- Prerequisites...
 - Ubuntu 20.04 or Debian 11
 - root access
 - A (sub)domain name
 - e-mail delivery service or other SMTP server


Install Server

- On gentoo I failed on the first instruction
 # adduser --disabled-login mastodon
- adduser / useradd is not the same across Linux
- Gave up will try on a virtual machine... maybe
